SARAH JORSTAD'S NORWEGIAN RYE BREAD (Anna Marie Klein)

5 C. water 1 T. salt 2 C. molasses (I use Grandma's unsulphered) 2 C. rye flour

1 T. shortening 1 envelope + 1 tsp. yeast

 $\frac{1}{2}$ C. brown sugar $\frac{1}{2}$ C. white sugar

11-12 C. white flour

Measure water, molasses, shortening, sugars and salt into big bowl and heat until shortening is melted and mixture is warm. (I put this in the microwave and check after one minute. It usually takes about three minutes.) Stir in the rye flour and yeast. Stir in as much white flour as possible, then with your hands work in the rest. Knead until satiny and smooth. Cover, set in warm place and let rise until double in bulk. Punch down and let rise again, then shape into five loaves. Place in well greased loaf pans, cover and let rise again until double. Bake in 350 deg oven for 50 minutes. Makes 5 loaves. (Anna Marie furnished this bread for the December meeting.)
