January 15 NAHA (Norwegian American Historical Association) article of choice from one of thirty- three journals published by NAHA since 1926. Available in our library or on-line. (Change in time - 12:00 eat lunch at Cottage Grove, 12:45 discussion)

February 19 *Heritage of Darkness* by Kathleen Ernst. In this mystery, Chloe Ellefson, a curator visiting Vesterheim Norwegian Museum in Decorah, Iowa, finds a body in one of the antique immigrant trunks. Barb Erickson (dessert and discussion)

March19 Kon-Tiki by Thor Heyerdahl. The inspiring tale of daring and courage, a record of biologist Heyerdahl's adventure across the Pacific Ocean in a boat built of balsa wood, bamboo, and hemp. Ruth Christ (dessert and discussion)

April 16 Any book by children's author Jan Brett. The discussion will focus on her illustrations. Cindy Monroe (dessert and discussion) Ms. Brett's books are well-known for their colorful and detailed depictions of Scandinavia. After a trip to Norway, she was inspired to write three books!

RECIPE

Microwave Rommegrot (From Concordia Language Camp Cookbook)

1/2 C. butter

1/4 C. sugar

1/4 C. all-purpose flour

Dash of salt

3 C. milk

1 C. cream

Melt butter in microwave, cool slightly. Stir in sugar, flour and salt. In separate bowl, combine milk and cream. Cover and microwave to almost scalding. Mix a little of milk mixture with butter mixture, making sure there are no lumps. Microwave on HIGH for 3 to 4 minutes. Stir once each minute until thick. Serve warm with a little melted butter and cinnamon.
